Spring is here, Which also means Ticks and Mosquitoes are too!

That's right! It is that time of year to get your dog tested. Ticks and Mosquitoes carry some very nasty and potentially life-threatening diseases. Sometimes, you won't even know when your dog is infected. The best protection is preventative medicine for your dog by screening for these diseases every year. The 4Dx SNAP test for dogs requires a small blood sample and delivers quick results in 8 minutes. This test will check for:

- [Heartworm](#)- is transmitted by mosquitoes and causes a combination of medical problems including dysfunction of the lungs, heart, liver and kidneys.
- [Tick born disease](#)— Checks for Lyme, Anaplasmosis, and Ehrlichiosis disease.

There are many different ways to prevent these disease. When meeting with the doctor, they will discuss the best prevention for your dog according to your pet's risk of exposure.

Deworming Your Pet And Why It Is Important



Not only outdoor pets are at risk of getting intestinal worms. Intestinal worms (Tape worms, round worms, whip worms, and hook worms) produce eggs and are found in feces that can be easily tracked inside your home. These worms can be transmitted to other household pets, some of them to humans-especially young children.

By seeing a [Veterinarian](#), and bringing in a current stool sample, we are able to prescribe the best medication based on the type of intestinal worms your pet has.
